

### **Eligibility:**

All the candidates who have passed H.S. Examination or equivalent (10+2) Examination in the year(s): **2017/2018/2019/2020** are eligible for applying for General Courses (Arts, Science and Commerce) in the College. The eligibility to apply in Honours subjects are given below:

Computer Science	45% marks in H.S. in Best five aggregate	Mathematics: 30%

<b>Music</b>	40% marks in H.S. in Best five aggregate	Minimum 45% marks in any One Language Paper in H.S./10+2
Nutrition	45% marks in H.S. in Best five aggregate and 30% in Chemistry	45% marks in H.S. in Best five aggregate and 30% in Chemistry
Economics	45% marks in H.S. in Best five aggregate	Mathematics: 30% in H.S./10+2

### **Calculation of Grade Point:**

The admission will strictly be on merit basis. The merit list will be prepared on the basis of **Grade Points** obtained by the applicants. The procedure for calculating Grade Point is given below:

#### **For Honours Course:**

(Except for applying into honours subjects: Mass Communication and Journalism and Music) **Grade Point** = [Total marks obtained in **Best FIVE** papers in H.S./10+2 level (except Environmental Studies) + marks obtained in the **subject applied for Honours Course**] + 20 per cent aggregate marks (out of 700 ) of the Secondary Exam.

**\*\*In case the applicant student did not have Computer Science as an H.S./10+2 equivalent subject, the candidate needs to add their Mathematics marks from H.S./10+2 equivalent in its place. If the applicant student had Computer Application as 10+2 equivalent subject, the marks of Computer Application will not be taken into any consideration. Only Computer Science marks from 10+2 is to be added/considered.**

**Note:** It is customary for the applicant student to have the specific Honours subject that s/he is applying Honours for in his/her chosen H.S. mark sheet. The score of the subject must be 45% or more. It is not applicable for the applicants of Mass Communication and Journalism, Music and Computer Science.

**If any student obtained 500 Marks in Secondary Examination out of 700 then 20 per cent of the aggregate stands 100\*\***

\*Applied for Honours in History

$$\text{Grade Point} = (62+75+82+80+77+77^*)+100^{**} = 553$$

**The exceptions are given below—**

**For Mass Comm. and Journalism and Music (Honours):**

Grade Point = [Total marks obtained in Best FIVE papers in H.S./10+2 level (except Environmental Studies) + **the highest marks obtained among the two Language papers**]+ 20 per cent aggregate marks of the Secondary Exam.

**For General Course (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.):**

Grade Point = **Total marks obtained in Best FIVE papers in H.S./10+2 level (except Environmental Studies)**
